This parking guide provides a quick overview of the main parking rules in Copenhagen.

HOW TO PAY FOR PARKING

You can pay by card at the pay stations located in the streets.

Please note that you will be asked to enter your number plate.

You can view the location of the pay stations at kk.dk/p-automater.

NO PRINTED TICKET

Your payment is registered electronically. You will not receive a printed ticket to be placed in your car.

MOBILE PAYMENT

You can pay via your smart phone, if you download an app from one of the providers displayed on the pay station.

PARKING PERMIT

Different types of parking permits are available to permanent residents and businesses with a company address in Copenhagen.

To find information about the different types of parking permits and select the option that best covers your or your company's needs, please go to parking.kk.dk.



PARKING FINES


If you have received a parking fine, you can find information about it at parking.kk.dk. Log in using the number plate of the vehicle and the reference number of the parking fine. Thereby, you will be able to see the parking warden's photos and explanation and get guidance on how to pay or complain.

PARKING RULES AND REGULATIONS

The rules and regulations applicable for parking in Copenhagen are defined in the Road Traffic Act and related statutory instruments. The same rules apply to motorcycles and electric vehicles.

TIME-RESTRICTED PARKING


 In these areas, you need to use your parking disc. Set the pointer to indicate the time of arrival.

You are not permitted to park for longer time than the number of hours indicated on the sign – nor if you pay.

Please be aware that "time" is Danish for hour.

NO PARKING


 Parking is not allowed, but you may stop for up to three minutes.


You are permitted to load or unload goods or passengers.


NO STOPPING

 It is prohibited to stop or park. You are not allowed to load or unload goods or passengers.

WHEN AND WHERE DO SIGNS APPLY?

 Before and after: the sign applies on the road before and after the sign post.

 After: The sign applies on the road after the sign post.

 Before: The sign applies on the road before the sign post.

 Monday - Friday (Saturday)
Sunday and public holidays

Note that "øvrig tid" covers any period not specified on the sign.

LOCAL RULES

Please be aware that a parking permit or hourly payment does not exempt you from respecting local parking regulations indicated on signs or by road markings.

DISABILITY BADGES

Free parking is provided in all zones for vehicles with a valid and visible disability badge.

Note that the disability badge does not allow you to park, where stopping is prohibited.



PEDESTRIAN PRECINCT

Entry by motor vehicle is only permitted if so indicated on the sign. You are not allowed to park unless specifically marked parking bays are available.



RECREATION AND PLAY AREA

You are not allowed to park, unless specifically marked parking bays are available.



PARK AND PAY AREA STARTS

By passing the sign, you enter the zone, where payment for parking is required.

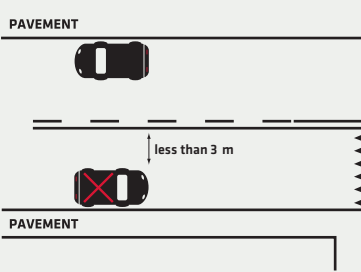


PARK AND PAY AREA ENDS

By passing the sign, you exit the zone, where payment for parking is required.

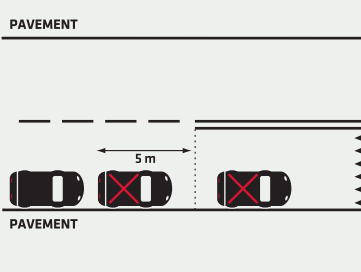
CARRIAGEWAY LINES

You are not allowed to stop or park next to a continuous white line marking a traffic lane, if the distance between the vehicle and the line is less than three metres, except if there is a broken white line between the vehicle and the continuous white line.



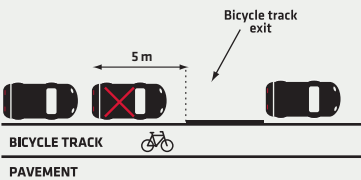
APPROACH AREAS

You are not allowed to stop or park where traffic approaching an intersection is divided into lanes by continuous white lines. There must be at least five metres from the parked vehicle to the start of the continuous white lines.

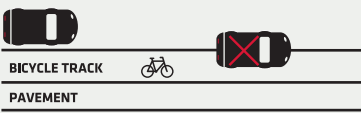


BICYCLE TRACK

You are not allowed to park or stop on or within 5 metres from the exit point of a bicycle track. You may stop on the opposite side of the exit, if the bicycle track runs along the road.



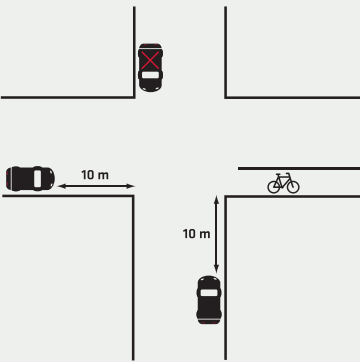
You are not allowed to stop or park wholly or partially on a bicycle track or pavement.



10-METRE-RULE

You are not allowed to stop or park within an intersection or less than 10 metres from the nearest kerb of a crossing road or bicycle track.

Yellow triangles on the kerbstones mark the 10 metres. These service markings are only indicative.



PARKING IN COPENHAGEN

If you park within the Park and Pay area, you must pay for parking.

The Park and Pay area is divided into four pay zones with different tariff levels. It is most expensive to park close to the city centre.

When you pay for parking, your payment is valid in the chosen pay zone and possible cheaper zone(s).
